

#### Guidelines for Scholarship

1. Only graduating high school seniors who are dependent(s) of MATC members are eligible to receive a scholarship in the year they graduate from high school.
2. Each graduating senior who would like a scholarship must make a request in writing to the President, MATC, no later than May 1 of the year of graduation.
3. Within the request, the student should identify the institution they plan to attend and the major course of study.
4. MATC scholarship funds will be available to applicants who are planning to attend any University, College, Community College, Junior College or Trade School. The scholarship will be paid directly to the applicant in the form of a MATC check shortly before the beginning of the fall semester and may be used for tuition, books, supplies, etc., necessary to begin school.
5. The parent (guardian) of the student requesting a scholarship, must have been a member of MATC for at least one year immediately prior to the date of application for the scholarship and remain a member during the year in which the scholarship is to be awarded. If the student turns 19 years of age prior to awarding of the scholarship, they must become a member of MATC in their own right.
6. Additional information requested with the application are: work experience, high school extra-curricular activities, awards, civic affiliations, and the name and address of the high school and high school principal.
7. A recent picture is requested to accompany the application and will be returned to applicant.
